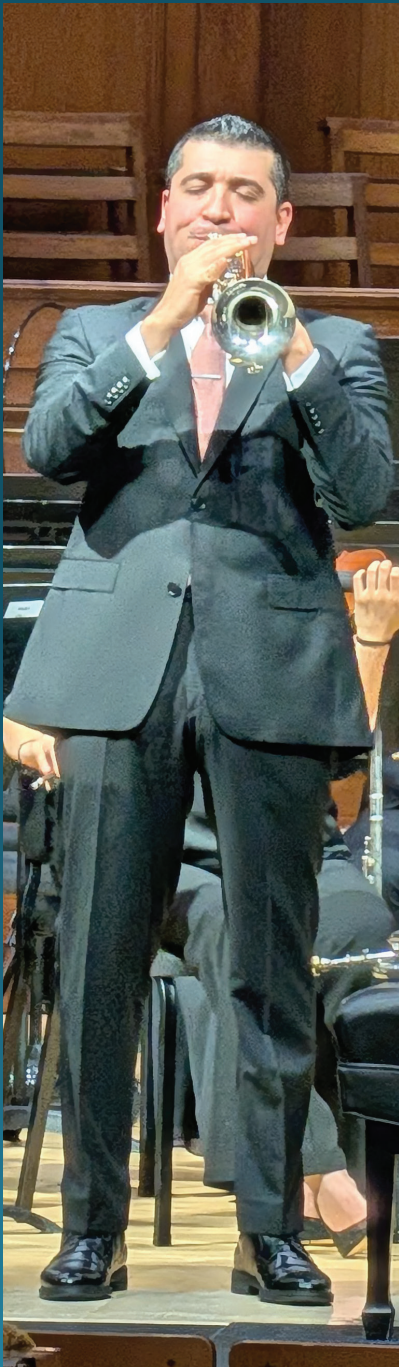

THE 2026 CONCERT SERIES

IRSA presented a season of exceptional orchestras and musicians, giving audiences in Indian River County the opportunity to experience performances by nationally and internationally recognized ensembles and artists.

The season included three sold-out performances – **The Academy, Prague, and Buffalo** – an important milestone for IRSA and evidence of the strong community interest in exceptional live orchestral music. This year we **sold 644 season ticket packages**.

Beyond attendance, the season demonstrated the value of presenting artists and ensembles that audiences might otherwise have to travel considerable distances to experience.

INVESTING IN THE FUTURE OF MUSIC

A Concert for More Than 1,300 Fifth Grade Students

One of IRSA's most significant educational initiatives this year was our annual concert for **students from throughout Indian River County**. Over the past 25 years, we have reached more than 25,000 students with this initiative.

For many students, this was an opportunity to experience a full symphony orchestra in a live performance setting – perhaps for the first time.

IRSA worked to make the experience more meaningful than simply attending a concert. **Curriculum materials were provided to teachers in advance**, giving students an opportunity to learn about the orchestra, instruments, composers, and music they would hear before arriving at the performance.

This approach helps transform a concert into an educational experience, allowing students to arrive with context and curiosity and to make connections between classroom learning and live musical performance.

Why It Matters

Music education can open doors to creativity, critical thinking, discipline, collaboration, and cultural understanding. By bringing young people into direct contact with professional musicians and live orchestral music, IRSA is helping introduce the next generation to the power and beauty of symphonic music.

SUPPORTING STUDENT MUSICIANS

IRSA’s commitment to education extends beyond introducing young people to orchestral music. We also seek to help promising student musicians develop their talents and continue their musical education with practical support including music lessons, performance opportunities, and competitions.

During the 2025 – 2026 season, IRSA provided scholarships and awards for student musicians to pursue their musical development, **totaling \$2,500**. We proudly presented our 2026 Concerto Competition on May 11, featuring outstanding young musicians from across the region in Elementary, Middle School, and High School divisions. The competition showcased performances in violin, clarinet, and cello and awarded recipients for their remarkable achievements and contributions to the musical life of our community.

PUTTING INSTRUMENTS IN THE HANDS OF YOUNG MUSICIANS

Forte 3D Instruments

IRSA began an innovative partnership with Forte 3D to provide high-quality, durable instruments to student musicians.

The instruments are made using 3D-printed carbon-fiber technology, making them particularly well suited to Florida’s challenging climate. Unlike traditional wooden instruments, these instruments are exceptionally durable and resistant to many of the environmental conditions that can affect conventional instruments.

Each instrument represents more than an equipment donation. It represents an opportunity for a young musician to practice, perform, compete, and continue developing a lifelong relationship with music.

The program is designed with sustainability in mind as well: as students graduate and move forward, instruments can be passed on to other deserving students.

Donations to IRSA allowed for the purchase of five violins and two cellos from Forte3D. These instruments will be assigned to local music students in the fall of 2027.

Pre-Concert Talks

IRSA continued to expand the educational and cultural experience surrounding its concerts by offering **4 pre-concert talks this season**, delivered by conductors, musicians, and soloists.

As a donor benefit, these presentations give patrons an opportunity to learn more about the music, composers, performers, and historical or cultural context before the concert begins. They also help audiences listen more deeply and discover new ways to understand and appreciate orchestral music.

A SEASON OF GROWTH AND SUCCESS

Building on momentum. Strengthening the organization.

The 2025 – 2026 season was one of IRSA's most successful seasons to date. Three concerts sold out, including **The Academy of St Martin in the Field, Prague Philharmonia, and the Buffalo Philharmonic**, demonstrating the continued enthusiasm for the quality of performances IRSA brings to Indian River County.

Fundraising also exceeded expectations, with contributions surpassing the season's goal by nearly **\$80,000**. This financial strength provides IRSA with an important foundation for continuing to present exceptional orchestras while expanding educational and community programs.

Very importantly, we have expanded and strengthened our staffing. After more than seven years as Managing Director, Staci Rosbury transitioned into a new role as our Marketing Consultant. This transition has already brought significant benefits to IRSA, including engaging social media content, regular emails featuring timely and useful information, and increased visibility through interviews with local media.

In May, Teresa Cannady joined IRSA as our new Managing Director. A former international development specialist and attorney, Teresa brings more than 30 years of professional experience and a lifelong love of music. She has supported IRSA for many years, including as a volunteer usher, and brings both a deep familiarity with the organization and a strong commitment to its mission. We also added Becky Silliman, a former teacher and flutist, as our part-time assistant director who provides excellent support and local community knowledge for the team.

We are also deeply grateful to our dedicated volunteer ushers, whose service is essential to the success of every concert. We especially thank our lead usher, Norma Mellor, for her outstanding leadership and commitment.
